### IMPACT making an impact - Grantee Spotlight

## Rotary Youth Club Grant = Safer and Happier Kids!

We have now made the final installment of our 2014 grant for a wonderful project of the Fairhope-Point Clear Rotary Youth Program, the expansion of their Youth Club Education Center. This program has already been very successful, steadily increasing the number of youth they serve in terms of attendance and capacity.

The expansion is almost complete. The addition is up, walls have been painted, tile set, and the vestibule secured. There is an expanded computer lab, multi-use classrooms, handicap-accessible restroom and a weather-safe area. Once the expansion is completely finished, each grade level will have their own room instead of being in a large group setting and having to do their homework in the gym. The room will provide each class with a "Quiet Zone" so they can better hear their teachers. There will also be a special area for parents to drop off and pick up their children, providing a safer, more secure "home away from home."

Impact 100 members attended the ground-breaking ceremony on June 2, 2015 and Impact President Becky Sappington spoke as a part of the program.

Shannon Spinks, Impact-RYC grant liaison, says that the Rotary Youth Club is extremely grateful for our grant and for the support of the community. They now serve an average over 100 kids daily, as compared to last year's 65-70. But this is just the beginning. When the Center is completely finished, they will be able to serve 150 youth each day, twice the number they used to be able to accommodate. Now, that's quite an IMPACT!
